The highlight of the day was the live demonstration by the Fire Service team. Students watched intently as the officers demonstrated the PASS (Pull, Aim, Squeeze, Sweep) technique to handle fire extinguishers. The session concluded with a brief debriefing where the efforts of the students were lauded. This drill was not just a practice session but a vital reminder that preparedness is our best defence. As we return to our classrooms, we do so with the confidence that at Maria School, safety is always a top priority.

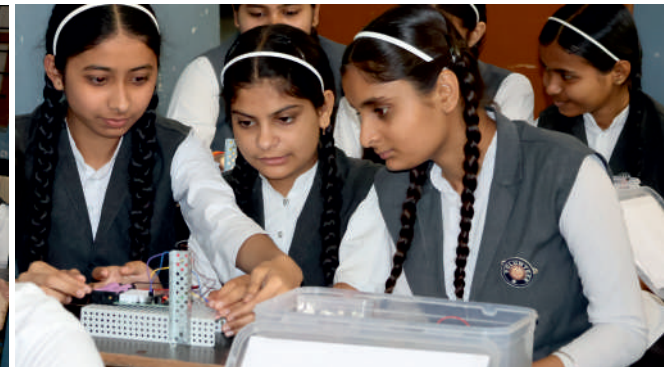
